This booklet is a compilation of a series of sermons I preached at Grace Baptist Church. They were not intended to be written in book form. I trust they will be a blessing in the format that they are in.

2 Timothy 3:16 All scripture *is* given by inspiration of God, and *is* profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness:

God inspired the writers of the Bible so that the end result was the very Words of God. God promised we would have them preserved for us:

Psalms 12:6-7 The words of the LORD *are* pure words: *as* silver tried in a furnace of earth, purified seven times. Thou shalt keep them, O LORD, **thou shalt preserve them from this generation for ever**.

The Old Testament has 39 books and the New Testament has 27 books.

Much discernment is required when studying the Word of God:

1 John 4:1 & 6 Beloved, believe not every spirit, but try the spirits whether they are of God: because many false prophets are gone out into the world. We are of God: he that knoweth God heareth us; he that is not of God heareth not us. Hereby know we the spirit of truth, and the spirit of error.

False doctrine has a spirit (demon) behind it and a person teaching it. Beware of false prophets.

2 Timothy 2:15 Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, **rightly dividing the word of truth.**

Consideration must be given to the placement within the Bible.

Job is a poetical book and not written for doctrinal purposes. Romans is a *Theological Treatise* and would be a primary source for the doctrine of salvation. Matthew through Acts are written from a historical perspective. Doctrine maybe found in these five books, but they are not primary sources for it.

Can I lose my salvation? Study Romans, Galatians or Ephesians.

Is there a resurrection from the dead? Study I Corinthians chapter 15.

Biblical tongues? Historical account in Acts / Doctrinal teaching in 1 Corinthians ch. 12-14

Is Prov. 22:6 a promise of God? No, Proverbs are wise sayings that generally applied are generally true.

Revelation 1:1 The **Revelation of Jesus Christ**, which God gave unto him, to shew unto his servants things which must shortly come to pass; and he sent and signified *it* by his angel unto his servant John.

From beginning to end, the Bible is primarily a book about the Lord Jesus Christ. Does He dwell in your heart? He loves you!

Adam was to rule on earth as King

Genesis 1:26-28 And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have **dominion over** the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over **all the earth**...and God said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish...and have **dominion over** the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over **every living thing that moveth upon the earth**.

Christ will rule forever

Luke 1:31-33 And, behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son, and shalt call his name JESUS. He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Highest: and the Lord God shall give unto him the throne of his father David: And he shall reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there shall be no end.

Christ's Position Today

Ephesians 1:20-21 Which he wrought in Christ, when he raised him from the dead, and set *him* at his own right hand in the heavenly *places*, **Far above** <u>all</u> principality, **and** power, **and** might, **and** dominion, **and** every name that is named, **not only** in this world, but **also** in that which is to come:

Us – Be Patient

1 Peter **5:10-11** But the God of all grace, who hath called us unto his eternal glory by Christ Jesus, after that ye have suffered a while, make you perfect, stablish, strengthen, settle *you*. To him *be* glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.

Jude 1:21-25 Keep yourselves in the love of God, looking for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ unto eternal life. And of some have compassion, making a difference: And others save with fear, pulling *them* out of the fire; hating even the garment spotted by the flesh. Now unto him that is able to keep you from falling, and to present *you* faultless before the presence of his glory with exceeding joy, To the **only wise God our Saviour**, *be* glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and ever. Amen.

In Eternity

Revelation 1:6 And hath made us kings and priests unto God and his Father; to him *be* glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.

Revelation 5:10 And hast made us unto our God kings and priests: and we shall reign on the earth.

Isaiah 9:6-7 For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the **government shall be upon his shoulder**: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counseller, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace. **Of the increase of** *his* **government and peace** *there shall be* **no end**, upon the throne of David, and upon his kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from henceforth even for ever. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will perform this.

Central Theme of the Bible: Blood of the Lamb

Isaiah 53:5-7 But he *was* wounded for our transgressions, *he was* bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace *was* upon him; and with his stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth: he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he openeth not his mouth. (700 B.C.)

Acts 8:32-35 The place of the scripture which he read was this, He was led as a sheep to the slaughter; and like a lamb dumb before his shearer, so opened he not his mouth...And the eunuch answered Philip, and said, I pray thee, of whom speaketh the prophet this? of himself, or of some other man? Then Philip opened his mouth, and began at the same scripture, and preached unto him Jesus. (34 A.D.)

John 1:29 The next day John seeth Jesus coming unto him, and saith, Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world.

1 Peter 1:18-19 Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, *as* silver and gold, from your vain conversation *received* by tradition from your fathers; But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot:

Revelation 5:6 & 9 And I beheld, and, lo, in the **midst of the throne** and of the four beasts, and in the midst of the elders, stood **a Lamb as it had been slain**... And they sung a new song, saying, Thou...**hast redeemed us to God by thy blood** out of every kindred, and tongue, and people, and nation;

Way to God – Faith & Blood

Romans 3:25 Whom God hath set forth *to be* a propitiation through **faith in his blood**, to declare his righteousness for the remission of sins that are past, through the forbearance of God;

Illustrated in the O.T.

Genesis 22:7-8 And Isaac spake unto Abraham his father, and said, My father: and he said, Here *am* I, my son. And he said, Behold the fire and the wood: but **where** *is* **the lamb for a burnt offering?** And Abraham said, My son, **God will provide himself a lamb for a burnt offering**: so they went both of them together.

Exodus 12:13 And the blood shall be to you for a token upon the houses where ye *are*: and **when I see the blood, I will pass over you**, and the plague shall **not be upon you to destroy** *you*...

1 Corinthians 5:7 ... For even Christ our passover is sacrificed for us:

In Eternity

Revelation 22:3 And there shall be no more curse: but the throne of God and of the Lamb shall be in it; and his servants shall serve him:

The word *covenant* is found 292 times in the Bible. God deals with humans based upon them.

Isaiah 55:9 For *as* the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts.

Genesis 9:11-17 And I will establish **my covenant with you**; neither shall all flesh be cut off any more by the waters of a flood; neither shall there any more be a flood to destroy the earth. And God said, This *is* the token of the covenant which I make between me and you and every living creature that *is* with you, for perpetual generations: I do set my **bow in the cloud**, and **it shall be for a token of a covenant** between me and the earth. And it shall come to pass, when I bring a cloud over the earth, that the bow shall be seen in the cloud: And I will remember my covenant, which *is* between me and you and every living creature of all flesh; and the waters shall no more become a flood to destroy all flesh. And the bow shall be in the cloud; and I will look upon it, that I may remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that *is* upon the earth. And God said unto Noah, This *is* the token of the covenant, which I have established between me and all flesh that *is* upon the earth.

A *Testament* is a covenant that goes into effect after the Testator dies.

Heb. 9:16-17 For where a testament *is*, there must also of necessity be the death of the testator. For a testament *is* of force after men are dead: otherwise it is of no strength at all while the testator liveth.

Matt. 26:28 For this is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for many for the remission of sins.

Compare Noah's Covenant with the Rainbow & the New Testament Covenant of Christ's Blood

- 1) Both of these everlasting covenants were a plan from the mind of God. The covenant of grace could no more have been made by man than he could form a bow in the clouds.
- It was affected by God's smelling a sweet savour. (Ge. 8:21, 9:9)
 Ephesians 5:2 And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweetsmelling savour.
- 3) The Guarantee / Promise of Wrath Avoided Isaiah 54:9 For this is as the waters of Noah unto me: for as I have sworn that the waters of Noah should no more go over the earth; so have I sworn that I would not be wroth with thee, nor rebuke thee.
- 4) Seal of the Covenant has nothing more beautiful
 Eph. 4:30 And grieve not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption.

Entrance into an everlasting covenant with the Father is through the Blood of Jesus Christ.

John 5:24 Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life.

Genesis: 4 Events: Creation / Fall / Flood / Babel Ch 1-11 4 People: Abraham / Isaac / Jacob / Joseph Ch. 12-50

In Genesis, God shows us His plan in types:

Supernatural Birth – Impossibility of Abraham & Sarah to reproduce: **Romans 4:19** And being not weak in faith, he considered not **his own body now dead**, when he was about an hundred years old, neither yet the **deadness of Sara's womb**:

Sinless Life – Adam, as man without sin, pictures Christ

Romans 5:14 Nevertheless death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over them that had not sinned after the similitude of Adam's transgression, who is the figure of him that was to come.

Jesus, as God is from Everlasting – Melchizedek is described in Hebrews chapter 7 **Hebrews 7:3** Without father, without mother, without descent, having neither beginning of days, nor end of life; but made like unto the Son of God; abideth a priest continually.

Resurrection of Christ – Isaac was raised off altar on the third day in Genesis chapter 22 **Hebrews 11:19** Accounting that God *was* able to raise *him* up, even from the dead; from whence also he received him in a figure. (Also see Matt. 12:40)

The Hebrew Race starts in Gen. 12. *Hebrew* is a race; *Israel* is a nation and *Jew* is a tribal word from *Judah*. Jacob is Israel. Israel is Jehovah's wife. The word *people* is found 174 times in Exodus.

• God called a *people* out of Egypt Delivered by blood of innocent lamb / judgment spared

Exodus 12:13 And the blood shall be to you for a token upon the houses where ye *are*: and **when I see the blood**, I will **pass over you**, and the plague shall **not be upon you to destroy** *you*...

1 Corinthians 5:7 ... For even Christ our passover is sacrificed for us:

• God provides for His people In spite of their rebellion, God provides for His children

Exo. 16: No food – Manna provided / Exo. 17: No water – water from the Rock

Exo. 32: They turn to other gods and no one wants to claim them as their people:

Exo. 32:7 ... the LORD said unto Moses, Go, get thee down; for thy people, which thou broughtest out

Exo. 32:9 ...the LORD said unto Moses, **I have seen this people**, and, behold, it *is* a stiffnecked people:

Exo. 32:11 And **Moses besought the LORD** his God, and said, LORD, why doth thy wrath wax hot against **thy people**, which **thou hast brought forth out** of the land of Egypt with great power...

Blood of Lamb pictures salvation / Red Sea waters pictures Water Baptism Promised Land pictures the Life of Faith – A life of conflict, battles and victories

• God's people teach us about a Step of Faith

1) Faith steps out based on the Promise of God

Joshua 3:10 And Joshua said, Hereby ye shall know that the living God *is* among you, and *that* **he will without fail drive out** from before you the Canaanites, and the Hittites, and the Hivites, and the Perizzites, and the Girgashites, and the Amorites, and the Jebusites.

2) God moves <u>after</u> you are committed. There is a point of 'no return' with a step.

Joshua 3:13 And it shall come to pass, as soon as the soles of the feet of the priests that bear the ark of the LORD, the Lord of all the earth, shall rest in the waters of Jordan, *that* the waters of Jordan shall be cut off *from* the waters that come down from above; and they shall stand upon an heap.

Judges through 2 Chronicles

Judges – Incomplete mastery leads to sin and failure

Luz – one man let go and city is rebuilt (Judges 1:23-26)

God calls incomplete obedience rebellion (I Sam. 15:20-24)

Samuel is the last of Judges; Saul is first of kings. It was God's will for a king, just not His time yet.

Saul – King of the people Like Antichrist

David – King chosen by God / Jesus is from this line; "Son of David"

1 Kings 2:45 ...and the throne of David shall be established before the LORD for ever.

Solomon – shows magnificence of Christ kingdom to come

1 Kings **10:7** Howbeit I believed not the words, until I came, and mine eyes had seen *it*: and, behold, the half was not told me: thy wisdom and prosperity exceedeth the fame which I heard.

Divided Kingdom

N. Kingdom 10 tribes / Samaria was capital / all bad kings

S. Kingdom 2 tribes / Jerusalem was capital / some good kings, some bad kings

Babylonian Captivity

Poetical Books

The poetical books are five books that deal with poetry in their form. They are real people who grapple with profound problems and express big realities and great truths.

Spiritual Progress

Job – Death of Self-life Psalms – New Life in God Proverbs – Wisdom for Daily Life Ecclesiastes – Contentment Found in Serving God Song of Solomon – Love of Christ & Love for Christ Death of Self New Life Disciplined Life Wean from Worldliness Heavenly Bridegroom

Job discovered who he was. Trials bring the dross of sin in our life:

Job 1:8 And the LORD said unto Satan, Hast thou considered my servant Job, that *there is* none like him in the earth, a perfect and an upright man, one that feareth God, and escheweth evil? **Job 42:6** Wherefore I abhor *myself*, and repent in dust and ashes.

God uses tribulation to purge us from sin and refine our life.

Romans 5:3-5 "... tribulation worketh patience; And patience, experience; and experience, hope: And hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost..."

Job was not meant to know the explanation of his trial. Not knowing causes us to trust God.

Proverbs 3:5 Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding.

If we could understand our trials, there would be no need to trust God. He is an all wise God.

God gives grace for every trial.

2 Corinthians 12:9-10 And he said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me. Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities... for when I am weak, then am I strong.

Romans 8:28 And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God...

Romans 8:18 For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time *are* not worthy *to be compared* with the glory which shall be revealed in us.

Ecclesiastes shows vanity of life. Life is vain if:

- View life selfishly rather than socially
- View life apart from God rather than controlled by Him
- View life as bounded by the grave rather than as having a destiny beyond death

Selfishly rather than socially

- Live to get rather than to give
- The more one lives for self, the less do earthly things satisfy
- When one lives to "get", then the more one gets, the less one really has
- A true paradox the more one gives the more one gets
- Those who do most for others, do most for themselves

This world is filled with selfish people – living self-centered – yet unhappy

We are taught of God to love others

John 13:34 A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another.

John 15:12 This is my commandment, That ye love one another, as I have loved you.

John 15:17 These things I command you, that ye love one another.

1 Thessalonians **4**:**9** But as touching brotherly love ye need not that I write unto you: for ye yourselves are taught of God to love one another.

Ephesians 5:2 And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweetsmelling savour.

We are taught of God to live for others

Matthew 22:37-39 Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second *is* like unto it, **Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself**.

1 Peter 4:9 Use hospitality one to another without grudging.

John 13:14-15 & 17 If I then, *your* Lord and Master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that ye should do as I have done to you...If ye know these things, happy are ye if ye do them.

We are taught of God – the love of Christ

Song of Solomon 2:4 He brought me to the banqueting house, and his banner over me *was* love. **Song of Solomon 2:16** My beloved *is* mine, and I *am* his: he feedeth among the lilies. **Song of Solomon 6:3** I *am* my beloved's, and my beloved *is* mine: he feedeth among the lilies.

You know Him. Does He know you? He loves you. Do you love Him?

2 Timothy 2:19 Nevertheless the foundation of God standeth sure, having this seal, The Lord knoweth them that are his. And, Let every one that nameth the name of Christ depart from iniquity.

Prophetical Books

There are 17 prophetical books - often broken down into 5 'major' prophets and 12 'minor' prophets. The prophets were called of God to foretell and tell-forth. They had authority from God. They were a speaker for God. They were often called to excite and arouse the people to turn back to Jehovah. False prophets were false in that they were not called of God.

Much of the O.T. prophecies are still unfulfilled. They mainly spoke to warn people, but foretelling as prophecy was also a part of their writings.

The N.T. term 'prophecy' is "to speak fervently for God." It is to tell-forth. Revelation has ceased with the completion of the Bible. The two N.T. offices of one called of God for today are Pastor-Teacher and Evangelist (church planter). The prophets were given an unction by God, but today every believer has an unction and is taught by the Holy Spirit. (I John 2:20 & 2:27).

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Obadiah 1:15 For the day of the LORD is near upon all the heathen...

That It Might Be Fulfilled

The O.T. is incomplete without Him. Without Jesus Christ:

- The Torah would have unexplained ceremonies
- The Psalms would have unappeased longings
- The Prophets would have unachieved purposes

Matthew, the connecting book of the O.T. & N.T. has 53 citations from the O.T. and 76 allusions to it.

• Prophecy: According to these verses: Jehovah / LORD is Jesus / Lord

Isaiah 40:3 The voice of him that crieth in the wilderness, Prepare ye the way of the LORD...

Matthew 3:3 For this is he that was spoken of by the prophet Esaias, saying, The voice of one crying in the wilderness, **Prepare ye the way of the Lord**, make his paths straight.

• Prophecy: When Jesus was born, he was as old as His Father and older than His mother

Micah 5:2 But thou, Bethlehem Ephratah, *though* thou be little among the thousands of Judah, *yet* out of thee shall he come forth unto me *that is* to be ruler in Israel; whose goings forth *have been* from of old, from everlasting.

Matthew 2:4-6 And when he (<u>Herod</u>) had gathered all the chief priests and scribes of the people together, he demanded of them where Christ should be born. And they said unto him, In Bethlehem of Judaea: for thus it is written by the prophet, And thou Bethlehem, *in* the land of Juda, art not the least among the princes of Juda: for out of thee shall come a Governor, that shall rule my people Israel.

• Prophecy: Birth of Jesus Christ

Matthew 1:21-23 And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins. Now all this was done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying, Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us.

Conceived by the Holy Ghost (His Father) and Mary as His mother 100% God / 100% Man.

• **Prophecy:** Kingdom healing from Isa. 53 was fulfilled. The kingdom of heaven is at hand.

Matthew 8:16-17 When the even was come, they brought unto him many that were possessed with devils: and he cast out the spirits with *his* word, and healed all that were sick: That it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Esaias the prophet, saying, Himself took our infirmities, and bare *our* sicknesses.

• Prophecy: Jesus spoke in Parables (Ps. 78:2)

Matthew 13:34-35 All these things spake Jesus unto the multitude in parables; and without a parable spake he not unto them: That it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, saying, I will open my mouth in parables; I will utter things which have been kept secret from the foundation of the world.

• Prophecy: Jesus Christ – King to Israel

Matthew 21:4-5 All this was done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, saying, Tell ye the daughter of Sion, Behold, thy King cometh unto thee, meek, and sitting upon an ass, and a colt the foal of an ass.

• Jesus came to Fulfill all Scripture

Matthew 26:53-56 Thinkest thou that I cannot now pray to my Father, and he shall presently give me more than twelve legions of angels? But how then shall the scriptures be fulfilled, that thus it must be? In that same hour said Jesus to the multitudes, Are ye come out as against a thief with swords and staves for to take me? I sat daily with you teaching in the temple, and ye laid no hold on me. But all this was done, that **the scriptures of the prophets might be fulfilled**. Then all the disciples forsook him, and fled. (See also Matt. 2:15, 2:17, 2:23, 4:14, 12:17, Luke 4:21, John 12:38, 13:18, 18:9)

• Rejected and Crucified

Matthew 27:9 Then was fulfilled that which was spoken by Jeremy the prophet, saying, And they took the thirty pieces of silver, the price of him that was valued, whom they of the children of Israel did value

John 19:24 ...Let us not rend it, but cast lots for it, whose it shall be: that the scripture might be fulfilled, which saith, They parted my raiment among them, and for my vesture they did cast lots.

Matt. 27:35 they crucified him, and parted his garments, casting lots: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, They parted my garments among them, and upon my vesture did they cast lots.

Mark 15:28 And the scripture was fulfilled, which saith, And he was numbered with the transgressors.

Luke 24:44 These *are* the words which I spake unto you, while I was yet with you, that all things must be fulfilled, which were written in the law of Moses, and *in* the prophets, and *in* the psalms, concerning me.

John 19:28 After this, Jesus knowing that all things were now accomplished, that the scripture might be fulfilled, saith, I thirst.

John 19:34-37 But one of the soldiers with a spear pierced his side, and forthwith came there out blood and water. And he that saw *it* bare record, and his record is true: and he knoweth that he saith true, that ye might believe. For these things were done, that the scripture should be fulfilled, A bone of him shall not be broken. And again another scripture saith, They shall look on him whom they pierced.

Isa. 53 is a Prophecy of Jesus Christ

Acts 8:32-35 The place of the scripture which he read was this, He was led as a sheep to the slaughter; and like a lamb dumb before his shearer, so opened he not his mouth... And the eunuch answered Philip, and said, I pray thee, of whom speaketh the prophet this? of himself, or of some other man? Then Philip opened his mouth, and began at the same scripture, and preached unto him Jesus.

Fulfilled prophecy written about 700 previous to its fulfillment is credible, intelligent and reasonable evidence to believe that the Bible is inspired by God as His Holy Bible.

"That it might be fulfilled" is found 13 times in Matthew. "And" is found 1,286 times in Mark. "Believe" or "Believeth" is found 69 times in John.

John is not contradictory, but complementary. 90% of material in John is not in other three gospels.

The picturesque of Christ's teaching is striking. There are figures, similes, analogies and imagery, relative to natural phenomena, animals, plants, agriculture and commerce. He speaks of lightning, earthquakes, fire, storm, light; oxen, sheep, wolves, birds, and serpents; houses, food, cooking and lamps; soil, sowing, and harvest; alms, tithes, prayers and fastings.

As Friend of Sinners, he forgave harlots and condemned hypocrites! **Luke 7:34** The Son of man is come eating and drinking; and ye say, Behold a gluttonous man, and a winebibber, a friend of publicans and sinners!

At His Birth

Matthew 2:11 ... they presented unto him gifts; gold, and frankincense, and myrrh.

At His Death Matthew 27:29 And when they had platted a crown of thorns, they put *it* upon his head... Matthew 27:34 They gave him vinegar to drink mingled with gall... Matthew 26:67 Then did they spit in his face...

His Humanity

Luke 2:52 And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favour with God and man.

His Sinlessness

5 Reasons the Early Church Fulfilled the Great Commission

1) Reality of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ

The lives of the disciples were changed by this fact.

Acts 2:32 This Jesus hath God raised up, whereof we all are witnesses.

Acts 4:2 ...they taught the people, and **preached** through Jesus the **resurrection** from the dead. Acts 4:33 And with great power gave the apostles witness of the resurrection of the Lord Jesus...

2) Coming of the Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit gave them power, which is the 'ability to do' what Jesus had commanded. He indwelt them to give them boldness to be witnesses.

Acts 1:8 But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost... Acts 2:41 Then they that gladly received his word were baptized: and the same day there were added *unto them* about three thousand souls.

Acts 4:4 ...many...which heard the word **believed**; and the number of the men was about **five thousand**. Acts 6:7 And the word of God increased; and the number of the disciples **multiplied** in Jerusalem **greatly**

3) Unity in Church

Acts 2:1 And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. Acts 2:44-45 And all that believed were together, and had all things common; And sold their possessions and goods, and parted them to all *men*, as every man had need.

Acts 4:34-35 Neither was there any among them that lacked: for as many as were possessors of lands or houses sold them, and brought the prices of the things that were sold, And laid *them* down at the apostles' feet: and distribution was made unto every man according as he had need.

4) Persecution

Acts 5:18 And laid their hands on the apostles, and put them in the common prison.

Acts 5:40 ...when they had called the apostles, and beaten *them*, they commanded that they should not speak in the name of Jesus, and let them go.

Acts 7:59 And they stoned Stephen, calling upon God, and saying, Lord Jesus, receive my spirit.

Acts 8:1 And Saul was consenting unto his death. And at that time there was a great persecution against the church which was at Jerusalem; and they were all scattered abroad...

Acts 9:23 And after that many days were fulfilled, the Jews took counsel to kill him:

- 30 A.D. Death of Jesus
- 45 A.D. James killed by sword by Herod Agrippa
- 64 A.D. James, ½ brother of Jesus stoned
- 64 A.D. Mark dragged to stake, died on the way

66 A.D. Nero, Emperor of Rome, begins persecution – used four main methods of killing Christians:

- A) Dress them in skins of beasts that they might be torn in pieces by wild animals
- B) Killed on a cross like their Savior
- C) Burned with torches and lamps under shoulders and other tender parts of their naked bodies
- D) Wrapped them in burning mantle coated with oil, pitch or wax and wound them around their hands and feet, in order to melt the very marrow in their bones¹

5) Proper Methodology of Missions

The church at Jerusalem started the church at Antioch which sent out Paul and Barnabus who started many churches that started churches which started churches....

Paul trained nationals and started churches that were self-supported and self-governing. Acts 14:23 And when they had ordained them elders in every church, and had prayed with fasting, they commended them to the Lord, on whom they believed. (See also Titus 1:5)

Acts 16:4-5 And as they went through the cities, they delivered them the decrees for to keep, that were ordained of the apostles and elders which were at Jerusalem. And so were the churches established in the faith, and increased in number daily*.

Starting a Church – Methodology from Acts 16:9-40

• Know it is will of God

Acts 16:10 And after he had seen the vision, immediately we endeavoured to go into Macedonia, assuredly gathering that the Lord had called us for to preach the gospel unto them.

• Witness to many and God will have some prepared

Acts 16:14 And a certain woman named Lydia, a seller of purple, of the city of Thyatira, which worshipped God, heard *us*: whose heart the Lord opened, that she attended unto the things which were spoken of Paul.

• God uses providence to those you witness to

Acts 16:22-25 And the multitude rose up together against them: and the magistrates rent off their clothes, and commanded to beat *them*. And when they had laid many stripes upon them, **they cast** *them* into prison, charging the jailor to keep them safely: Who, having received such a charge, thrust them into the inner prison, and made their feet fast in the stocks. And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God: and the prisoners heard them.

• Paul left city (forced out) in providence of God

Acts 16:39-40 ...and brought *them* out, and desired *them* to depart out of the city. And they went out of the prison...and when they had seen the brethren, they comforted them, and departed.

The church at Philippi was started with Lydia, a demon-possessed damsel and the Jailor and his family!

Purposes of the Tribulation

- God's wrath is poured out (Rev. 6:17)
- Multitudes of souls are saved (Rev. 7:9, Hab. 3:2)
- Israel is purged to receive Jesus Christ as their Messiah (Zech. 13:8-9, 12:10)

Revelation of Jesus Christ - the Unveiling of Jesus Christ

The Bible is primarily a book about the Lord Jesus Christ. He is the central theme. The word *revelation* literally means to unveil. Previously hidden, Jesus Christ is now unveiled as:

- Ch 1-3 The High Priest in Midst of Church
- Ch 4-5 Lamb Worthy of Praise
- Ch 6-18 Wrath of the Lamb Poured Out
- Ch 19:1-9 Marriage Supper of Lamb
- Ch 19:10-21 Coming King and Judge of All the Earth
- Ch 20 1000 Year Reign
- Ch 21-22 Lamb is the Light thereof

The "Sermon on the Mount" opens and closes with:

Matthew 5:1-2 And seeing the multitudes, he went up into a mountain: and when he was set, his disciples came unto him: And he opened his mouth, and taught them, saying,
Matthew 7:28-29 And it came to pass, when Jesus had ended these sayings, the people were astonished at his doctrine: For he taught them as *one* having authority, and not as the scribes.

Jesus took His disciples aside and taught them the truths about the Christian life. Below is an overview of this great teaching. His emphasis was that the Christian life is all about a real relationship not a religion. Do not be guilted into doing something for God; work for God because you love Him.

Here are eight truths you need if you are to be a disciple:

1) Blessedness is in the Heart Matt. 5:3-11

Blessedness comes from a heart that is right with God. The Christian life has *everything* to do with the heart. It is all about relationship, not rules.

Matthew 5:8 Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God.

2) Follow the Spirit of the Law not Letter of the Law Matt. 5:21-42

Jesus taught that the letter of the law is: do not murder nor commit adultery. The spirit of the law is: do not get angry without a cause and do not lust after a woman. One can follow the letter of the law and be a million miles away from God.

Matthew 5:22 But I say unto you, That whosoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment...

Matthew 5:28 But I say unto you, That whosoever looketh on a woman to lust after her hath committed adultery with her already in his heart.

3) Love Fulfills all the Law Matt. 5:45-48

Jesus taught that to be *perfect* as the Father in heaven is perfect, that one must love. Love means to love regardless of reciprocation. The Christian life is to love people as God does!

Matthew 5:44 But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you;

4) Be Private About What You Do For God Matt. 6:1-18

Be private about what you do for the Lord. Make sure your motives are pure and that you are doing what you do because you love God and not to be seen of men. People often do things 'to be seen of men' and that is rooted in pride. The Christian life is all about what God knows and sees rather than what others know and see about you. Your heart is an 'open book' to God.

The expression to 'not let thy left hand know what thy right hand doeth" is a Hebrew proverb which means to be private about your doings.

Matthew 6:3-4 But when thou doest alms, let not thy left hand know what thy right hand doeth: That thine alms may be in secret: and thy Father which seeth in secret himself shall reward thee openly. Matthew 6:6 But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet, and when thou hast shut thy door, pray to thy Father which is in secret; and thy Father which seeth in secret shall reward thee openly. Matthew 6:18 That thou appear not unto men to fast, but unto thy Father which is in secret: and thy Father, which seeth in secret, shall reward thee openly.

5) Live for Eternity / Trust God for Temporal Matt. 6:19-34

Don't live for things of this earth. Lay up rewards for the life to come. You will be dead a whole lot longer than you will be alive.

Matthew 6:19-20 Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal:

Trust God for your daily needs. He has promised to provide for you. After all, He is your Father! **Matthew 6:31-33** Therefore take no thought, saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Wherewithal shall we be clothed? ...for your heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of all these things. But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness...

6) Concern Yourself with Your sins Rather than Sins of Others Matt. 7:1-5

Matthew 7:3-4 And why beholdest thou the mote that is in thy brother's eye, but considerest not the beam that is in thine own eye? Or how wilt thou say to thy brother, Let me pull out the mote out of thine eye; and, behold, a beam *is* in thine own eye?

We have enough sins and problems within our own life to concern ourselves with. Make sure you address your own life and let others give account to God. Again, the focus is on our own heart.

7) There are Professors and There are Possessors Matt. 7:13-27

Few will make it to heaven and many will go to hell. Many church member, preachers, and deacons will end up in hell. You never really know who is saved. The only one you can know for sure is your own self.

Matthew 7:13-14 ...broad *is* the way, that **leadeth to destruction**, and many there be which go in thereat... and narrow *is* the way, which **leadeth unto life**, and few there be that find it.

Matthew 7:22-23 Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works? And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity.

8) Hear and Do Matt. 7:24-28

Matthew 7:24 Therefore whosoever heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock.

God's Dealing With Man

Lucifer sinned by pride & rebellion. It was an act of his will

Isaiah 14:12-14 How art thou fallen from heaven, O Lucifer, son of the morning! *how* art thou cut down to the ground, which didst weaken the nations! For thou hast said in thine heart, I will ascend into heaven, I will exalt my throne above the stars of God: I will sit also upon the mount of the congregation, in the sides of the north: I will ascend above the heights of the clouds; I will be like the most High.

Adam & Eve sinned by ignoring the command of God and "doing their own thing" / their own will.

Genesis 2:16-17 And the **LORD God commanded the man**, saying, Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat: But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die.

Jesus Christ came to earth to yield His will to the will of God. This was culminated at Gethsemane.

John 5:30 I can of mine own self do nothing: as I hear, I judge: and my judgment is just; because I seek not mine own will, but the will of the Father which hath sent me.

Luke 22:42 Saying, Father, if thou be willing, remove this cup from me: nevertheless not my will, but thine, be done.

Hebrews 5:7 Who in the days of his flesh, when he had offered up prayers and supplications with strong crying and tears unto him that was able to save him from death, and was heard in that he feared;

Hebrews 12:2 Looking unto Jesus... who for the joy that was set before him **endured the cross**, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.

Yielding to the will of God is preeminent. Yielding of your will to the Lord is a must for salvation.

Matthew 22:37-39 Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second *is* like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.

Romans 10:13 For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.

How God deals with a Human Being for Salvation

God works on conscience:

John 8:9 And they which heard it, being convicted by their own conscience, went out one by one...

God deals with a human being in their conscience. This is the area in the spirit of man that God reveals their sin and God then tugs on their 'heart' to bring them to an opportunity to yield to Jesus Christ and have a new birth.

God is primarily a Spirit who has a Soul so He can communicate with humans.

John 4:24 God is a Spirit: and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth.

Humans are primarily a Soul who have a Spirit so we can communicate with God.

Luke 9:23-24 And he said to *them* all, If any *man* will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me. For whosoever will save his life shall lose it: but whosoever will lose his life for my sake, the same shall save it.

Once God has spoken to the conscience (in the spirit of man), that human being decides

Soul / Personality = Intellect, Emotion, Will

Intellect – to know and understand truth and reality that the blood of Jesus Christ is shed for your sins

Emotions – may be an emotional time or may not be. Emotions can deceive us

Will – the deciding factor

Your <u>will</u> decides

Your will must be broken as the Holy Spirit speaks to your heart – as you invite Jesus Christ to be *your personal Savior.*

Man is exposed to truth and knows truth in his mind. God, the Holy Spirit works on the conscience (spirit) of man. Man now, with an act of his will, decides to either accept Jesus Christ or reject Jesus Christ.

He is Lord. Is He your Lord.

Philippians 2:10-11 That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of *things* in heaven, and *things* in earth, and *things* under the earth; And *that* every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ *is* Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Open your heart to receive Jesus Christ

Revelation 3:20 Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: **if any man hear** my voice, **and open** the door, I **will come in to him**, and will sup with him, and he with me.

John 8:32 And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.

You are a Cog in Worldwide Evangelism

Great Commission Given to the Church (1 Cor. 12:28)

Matt. 28:16 Then the eleven disciples went... into a mountain where Jesus had appointed them. Matt. 28:19 Go ye therefore, and teach all nations...

Mark 16:15 And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature.

Great Commission was Fulfilled within 33 Years (See also Rom. 10:18, 16:26)

Col. 1:5-6 truth of the gospel; Which is come unto you, as it is in all the world...

Col. 1:23 ... the hope of the gospel... which was preached to every creature which is under heaven...

How was this Accomplished?

Church Planting: churches planted churches that planted churches.

- Most effective missionary is one that trains nationals to start churches
- Acts 14:23 And when they had ordained them elders in every church, and had prayed with fasting, they commended them to the Lord, on whom they believed.

God's Plan is for your Church to Reach the World & your own City

Acts 1:8 But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me **both** <u>in Jerusalem</u>, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, <u>and unto the uttermost</u> part of the earth.

Both = "not only, but also" or "at the same time" Both = World and Local

Reach the World through training nationals to start churches

Acts 15:41 And he went through Syria and Cilicia, confirming the churches. These were churches not started by Paul. Church planting was the methodology of the first century church.

Reach your city through the leadership of the pastor / overseer

- Tract Ministry
- Door-to-door Ministry
- Bus Ministry
- Follow-up of Visitors
- Invite those you know to church
- Personal Witnessing in Daily Life / Give personal testimony
- Use Your Imagination

Sheep follow. Obey command of Jesus to "preach the gospel to every creature."

Acts 5:28 Saying, Did not we straitly command you that ye should not teach in this name? and, behold, ye have filled Jerusalem with your doctrine, and intend to bring this man's blood upon us.

Acts 20:20 And how I kept back nothing that was profitable *unto you*, but have shewed you, and have taught you publickly, and from house to house,

Human Failure

The Bible records an honest assessment of humanity. Sin reigns and human failure is prevalent. A quick overview of the Bible shows the flood in Noah's time only had eight people saved. This is within the first nine chapters of the Bible. Sin mars so much of human history. The time of the Judges, the divided kingdom and the reign of bad kings all reflect a sinful society. The Old Testament ends in apostasy.

The church age begins with the wonderful account of Pentecost and multitudes saved. It ends with the Laodicean church age which we are living in today. The majority of churches have left the pure Word of God and are striving to be seeker-friendly rather than Saviour-friendly.

Luke 18:8 I tell you that he will avenge them speedily. Nevertheless when the Son of man cometh, shall he find faith on the earth?

Negative Commands from God

Jeremiah was commanded to deliver the Word of God. There are 4 negative and 2 positive aspects:

Jeremiah 1:10 See, I have this day set thee over the nations and over the kingdoms, to root out, and to pull down, and to destroy, and to throw down, to build, and to plant.

These verses about the Bible & Bible preaching each contain 2 negatives and 1 positive:

2 Timothy 3:16 All scripture *is* given by inspiration of God, and *is* profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness:

2 Timothy 4:2 Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine.

Positive Command from God to Overcome Sin & Sinful Nature

Matthew 22:37-39 Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second *is* like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.

Romans 8:2 For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus hath made me free from the law of sin and death.

Galatians 5:16 This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfil the lust of the flesh.

The Holy Spirit indwells us. Thus, the nature of God abides and gives the born-again Christian the potential and ability to overcome sin. This is accomplished by practicing the Bible method of victory:

Galatians 2:20 I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me.

God's concepts transcend every age, language and culture. His truths are within the grasp of everyone.
